## DISCRETIONARY GRANTS

The 2023 I.D.E.A. Discretionary Grant application is open to United Way of Blount County community partners who attended the workshop offered by Omega Daughter, LLC. #### Affordable Housing Initiative

The Affordable Housing Initiative set out to acknowledge the top causes, effects, and barriers to accessing affordable housing in Blount County. In May of 2023, a generous grant from the Arconic Foundation helped fund and support the initiative's work. Collaborating with nonprofit organizations, government agencies, business partners, and community members, the Affordable Housing Initiative led listening sessions with City of Alcoa, City of Maryville and Blount County representatives, local real estate developers, Legal Aid of East TN, and Oak Ridge Housing Authority.

Three volunteer-supported committees inform the Affordable Housing Initiative.

- Celebrating one full year of meetings, the Systemic Issues Committee led by Bobby
   Eason, Executive Director of Foothills Community Development, addresses the barriers to and potential solutions to the housing crisis in
   Blount County.
- A Community Engagement Committee led by Angela Stolpe, Community Engagement Coordinator with United Way, began working to address community stigmas and concerns surrounding housing issues.



■ The 10-year Plan Committee, led by Wendy Wand, Vice President of United Way, is working to create a sustainable and data-driven 10-year plan to address the affordable housing crisis in Blount County.

#### **Poverty Education**

United Way of Blount County is the unifying force of this community in more ways than one. We offer educational opportunities for the community by teaming up with businesses, nonprofits, churches, and other groups to raise awareness and understanding of poverty and ALICE in Blount County. 


